

SAO TOME AND PRINCIPE CUSTOMS ADMINISTRATION:

Challenges and Opportunities



SUCCESSES IN GLOBAL TRADE

The Sao Tome and Principe Customs Administration (STPCA) is the primary agency responsible for enforcing customs and trade laws in Sao Tome and Principe. Despite facing significant challenges, the STPCA has made efforts to improve its operations and combat counterfeit and transnational crime.

Challenges

The STPCA has faced, and successfully overcome, several challenges, including limited resources, infrastructure, and a lack of trained personnel. The agency also recently faced security challenges, including the presence of armed groups and bandits in the country (STPCA, 2023).

According to the WCO, the STPCA has also participated in several international training programs, including a training program on customs enforcement organized by the WCO (WCO, 2022).

One such initiative is the publication of public awareness materials, including brochures and posters (STPCA, 2023).

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
